

**Dr. Sherrill Blodget** is Director of Choral Activities and Music Department Chair at Castleton University in Castleton, Vermont, where she directs the University Chorale and Castleton Chamber Singers, teaches voice and conducting, and is vocal director for musical theater productions. She is active as an adjudicator, clinician and guest conductor at home and abroad, and has a particular interest in Latin American choral music. Blodget was the 2019 Vermont State Colleges Faculty Fellow and has served in numerous positions on the Vermont ACDA Board. Blodget earned her D.M.A. in choral conducting with an orchestral conducting minor from the University of Arizona; M.M. in choral conducting from the University of Oregon; M.M. in music education from the Pennsylvania State University; and B.A. in music from Yale University.



**Nathaniel G. Lew** was educated at the Juilliard School, Yale University, Cambridge University, and the University of California, Berkeley, from which he received a Ph.D. in historical musicology. He is currently Professor of Music and Director of the Honors Program at St. Michael's College, where he teaches classical music history, music theory, musical theater history, and honors courses. He is the Artistic Director of the Vermont-based vocal ensemble Counterpoint, the editor of several previously unpublished works of Ralph Vaughan Williams, and the author of *Tonic to the Nation: Making English Music in the Festival of Britain* (2016).
